Amy J. Schwartz, MPA, is an active and passionate member of WCC since 2006. She is currently Vice Chair for Public Policy and Chair of the Public Policy Committee (PPC), where she heads the PPC Education Workgroup and co-founded and co-chaired the Task Force on Sexual Education in NYC Public Schools. She previously founded and chaired the Task Force on Physical Education in NYC Public Schools, and was a member of the Committees of Health and Education.

She has over two decades of experience advocating for improvements in the social welfare, health and well-being of New Yorkers. With a focus on public health and education, she consults on policy and advocacy campaigns for community groups, policy organizations and public schools. Amy has launched Wellness Councils in several city public schools, where she directed the development of health priorities and programs around physical activity, nutrition and wellness of students and larger community.
